# **Prior to Permit Application**

These are the steps and questions to answer prior to applying for a building permit:

# Planning.

- Critical areas evaluation. Submit site plan for review. Site plan must show all existing structures on property.
- Property zoning
- Setback requirements
- Is the property located in a floodway or floodplain?

#### **Public Works / Engineering Department.**

- Road Approach <u>Access permit</u>
- · Have an address assigned

# Q. What are the counties snow load, wind load, and frost depth

Α.

- · Adams counties snow load is 30 pound ground load.
- · Adams counties wind load is 85 mph for a 3 second gust.
- Adams counties frost depth is a min 18 inches below finnish grade.

# Q. What type of work requires a building permit?

A. Generally all types of construction work including: new homes, mobile home moves, repairs and additions, plumbing, re-roofing, window replacement, wood/pellet stove installations, and gas inserts. If you question whether or not

you need a permit, call the Adams County <u>Building and Planning Department</u> (509-488-9441). If you need a permit, please consult the departments, listed below, about their Approval processes before finalizing your construction plans.

### Q. Where do I obtain a building permit?

A. You may obtain a Building Permit Application form in person at <u>Building</u> and <u>Planning</u>, 425 E. Main St. - Suite 200, Othello, Monday through Friday: 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 and 1:00 - 4:30 p.m. Or download the form from the <u>Building and Planning</u>

# Q. How long does my application's review take?

A. <u>Building and Planning</u>'s review of your Application, complete with Site Plan Approvals, takes approximately one week. Be aware, however, that the Approvals from other departments -- such as Water/Sewer and Road Approach -- involve separate permit granting processes that may take additional time before you submit your Application.

Follow these steps to prepare and submit your Application for a Building Permit:

#### Prepare:

- 1. Complete the Building Permit Application form, points 1 through 8. **Do not use pencil**. The land parcel number can be obtained from the <u>Building and Planning</u> office (509-488-9441). Applications being submitted by persons other than the legal owner of record **must** include documentation making them a legal agent of the registered owner of record.
- **2.** Complete a plan of your site and the proposed work, drawn to scale using the Site Plan form provided. **Do not use pencil**. If you need help with the Site Plan, ask at the <u>Building and Planning</u> office.
- **3.** Obtain the following Approvals for your Site Plan drawing (you may need to present your completed Application form):

Zoning and Address Approval: Planning Department at 509/488-9441.

Water Availability Approval: The Adams County Environmental Health Department (509/488-2031) will help determine the specific requirements you must meet. (Note: Proof of water availability may not be required for additions / remodels to single family residences).

**Septic/Sewer Approval**: A residence must have a septic system permit or an Existing System Evaluation (ESE) from the <u>Environmental Health Department</u> (509/488-2031). If city / community sewer is available, an availability letter from the Sewer provider must be submitted.

**Fire Access Approval**: Your local fire chief (see Fire District map) must approve your driveway or access road (see Special Notes, below).

**Road Approach Approval**: Approach requirements vary according to the connecting road type. For example, an approach onto a

- -- <u>county road</u>: typically must be 330 ft. from the nearest arterial road; additional sight distance requirements vary according to posted speed limits
- -- state highway: requires verification that you have received approval from the

Washington State Dept. of Transportation (at 509/575-2541)

-- private road: requires documentation of legal ingress / egress easement.

#### Road Approach Premit App:

(Note a Road approach permit is required for all new construction. To include new homes, outbuildings etc. Exemptions: remodeling, roofing, mechanical and other type permits)

#### Submit:

- 1. Building Permit Application form, points 1 through 8 complete. Leave Notice box unsigned
- 2. Site Plan form with complete drawing and original Approval signatures
- **3.** For Commercial Bldg. or Residential Bldg. types of permit: **a)** two sets of construction plans, or **b)** Labor & Industries Approval (manufactured home; see Special Notes, below)
- 4. All special documents and letters noted in these Guidelines.

After your application is approved by <u>Building and Planning</u>, and you have paid the fees, you will receive a document that is your Permit to begin construction. Permit is valid for 180 days unless you request an extension. **The owner or contractor must request inspections during the construction process**, for example, footings, foundation walls, plumbing and mechanical work, framing, insulation, and wallboard will be examined by the Adams County Building Inspector (509-488-9441; 509-989-0973). Other inspections may be required if special constructions, such as a private road, are needed.

The owner or contractor is required to obtain a final inspection of <u>completed</u> work from the relevant agencies - including sewer and water connections and road approach work - <u>before</u> requesting the Building Inspector's Final Inspection. When the Building Inspector has completed the Final Inspection, obtain a signed copy of the final INSPECTION APPROVALS form or the CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY for your records.

#### SPECIAL NOTES:

- q Access roads or private driveways must allow access for emergency vehicles; they must be graveled to within 150 ft. of the most distant part of a building that requires a permit. Roads must have **20 ft. minimum width** (per Uniform Fire Code 902.2.1) and **3" base course** (of 2" minus pit run-minimum) with **2" top course** (of 1.25" minus crushed). Check with your <u>Fire District Chief</u> regarding "base course". (*Section 503.2.7 of the 2006 IFC fire code*).
- q For set-up of a manufactured home, obtain the *Installation Guidlines*.
- q Pre-June, 1976 manufactured homes have special requirements and may only be placed in a permitted Mobile Home Park. Contact <u>Department of Labor & Industries</u> (509-764-6900 in Moses Lake). Remodels to factory-assembled structures and manufactured homes also require <u>Department of Labor & Industries</u> approval.
- q To find out if your contractor is licensed: call **1-800-647-0982**. For the Underground Utility locations on your site, call **1-800-424-5555**.
- q The rules governing private covenants are the responsibility of the owner/builder.

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
